



Typical Dr Fogle style . Fast paced and covers what you need to know simply and concisely. The checklist is so vital it is reproduced here for you.

- \*Provide frequent short walks rather than one long walk.
- \*Groom more often--it helps circulation.
- \*Feed smaller meals more frequently.
- \*Provide your dog with soft bedding if it has calluses.
- \*Take your dog out after every meal, just before bedtime and first thing every morning.
- \*Watch your dog's weight. It will be healthier if kept trim.
- \*Provide warmth and comfort for sleeping and resting. Keep cool in summer.
- \*Change diet according to the dog's medical needs.

gives the breeds it purports to apply to. This table is worth looking at, but remember it is only an estimate.

#### It is followed by:

Factors affecting life expectancy such as DIET. "In the 2000's at least 2 dogs were still living at 27 or 28 years old, but one was fed a purely vegetarian diet and the other was fed primarily on Kangaroo and Emu meat."

The associated article "List of Oldest Dogs" is a great read. These REALLY old dogs, thriving in their late teens and twenties are divided into verified and unverified categories. A lot of the information on these websites is useful to owners of dogs of all ages. It is not advisable to wait until you consider your dog aged to become involved in regular observation and routine recording of the physical and behavioural aspects of your pet. Note that this information is also available for photocopy loan from the WEBSITE DIRECTORY in your Library

NB: There will be a reading of the ANZAC ode and 1 min silence before the commencement of the Sunday AM Trial

#### RULES FOR GEELONG OBEDIENCE DOG CLUB (INCORPORATED)

#### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

- 22 (1) The affairs of the Club shall be managed by a Committee of Management constituted as provided in Clause 24(1).
  - (2) The Committee:-
    - (a) shall control and manage the business and affairs of the Club.
    - (b) may, subject to these Rules, the Regulations and the Act, exercise all such powers and functions as may be exercised by the Club other than those powers and functions that are required by these Rules to be exercised by general meetings of the members of the Club; and
    - (c) subject to these Rules, the Regulations of the associations Incorporation Act, and the Act, has power to perform all such acts and things as appear to the Committee to be essential for the proper management of the business and affairs of the Club.
- 23 (1) The Officers of the Club shall be:- (see by-law No. 6)
  - (a) a President: (who will also be the Public Officer)
  - (b) 2 Vice-Presidents
  - (c) a Treasurer
  - (d) a Secretary
  - (e) an Assistant Secretary and Trial Secretary
  - (f) such other Officers as required (refer By-Law)
  - (2) The provisions of Clause 24 so far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications apply to and in relation to the election of persons to any of the offices mentioned in Sub-Clause 23(1)
  - (3) Each Officer of the Club shall hold office until the annual general meeting next after the date of his election but is eligible for re-election.
  - (4) In the event of a casual vacancy in any office referred to in Sub-Clause 23(1), the Committee may appoint one of its members to the vacant office and the member so appointed may continue in office until the annual general meeting next following the date of his appointment.
- 24 (1) Subject to section 23 of the Act, the Committee shall consist of:-
  - (a) the Officers of the Club: and
  - (b) 6 ordinary members each of whom shall be members of the VCA. and shall be elected at the annual general meeting of the Club in each year.
  - (2) Each ordinary member of the Committee shall, subject to these Rules, hold office until the annual general meeting next after the date of his election but is eligible for re-election.
  - (3) In the event of a casual vacancy occurring in the office of an ordinary member of the Committee, the Committee may appoint a member of the Club to fill the vacancy and the member so appointed shall hold office, subject to these Rules, until the annual general meeting next following the date of his appointment.

#### ELECTION OF COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT AND VACANCY

- 25 (1) Nomination of candidates for election as Officers of the Club or as ordinary members of the Committee:-
  - (a) shall be made in writing in such form as the Committee shall prescribe, signed by one member of the Club and accompanied by the written consent of the candidate (which may be endorsed on the form of nomination); and
  - (b) shall be delivered to the Secretary of the Club not less than 21 days before the date fixed for the holding of the annual general meeting.
  - (2) If insufficient nominations are received to fill all vacancies on the Committee, the candidates nominated shall be deemed to be elected and further nominations shall be receives at the annual general meeting subject to each nominee consenting to such nomination.
  - (3) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated shall be deemed to be elected.
  - (4) If the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, a ballot shall be held, for the purpose of Sub-Clause 25(5)(b) the Secretary shall, upon closure of nominations of candidates for election to the Committee of Management when a ballot becomes necessary under this Clause send forthwith to all members entitled to vote a list of all nominees in alphabetical order in respect of each position on the Committee of Management for which they have been nominated.
  - (5) The election of the Office Bearers and ordinary members of the Committee shall be by ballot:-
    - (a) cast by members present at the Annual General Meeting and eligible to vote thereat;
    - (b) notwithstanding Clause 25(5)(a) any member who is entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting, but unable to attend shall be entitled to apply to the Secretary for a postal vote. Application for a postal vote must be in writing and lodged with the Secretary fourteen days prior to the Annual General Meeting. Within seven days the Secretary in the presence of the President and one other Committee member appointed by the Committee will forward an initialled ballot paper to each applicant and record their names. Members to whom ballot papers are posted will under no circumstances be given a second ballot paper. Completed ballot papers are to be returned to the Returning Officer or the Secretary in envelopes endorsed, "Ballot Papers". These envelopes shall be handed (unopened), to the Returning Officer officiating at the poll.
  - (6) For the purposes of the ballot a Returning Officer shall be appointed at the General Meeting of members immediately proceeding the Annual General Meeting or as the second item of business of the Annual General Meeting, and not less than two scrutineers shall be appointed by the members at, and as, the second item of business of the Annual General Meeting.
  - (7) Each member wishing to participate in the ballot shall strike out from the ballot paper, all names in excess of the number of positions vacant and ballot papers containing a greater or lesser number of candidates to be elected shall be invalid.
  - (8) After the appointment of the Returning Officer and the Scrutineers, the Returning Officer and the Scrutineers shall count the postal votes returned in accordance with Clause 25(5) and the votes cast by members in accordance with Clauses 25(5) and 25(7).
  - (9) The Returning Officer shall declare the result of the ballot immediately after the votes have been counted, and in the event of an equality of votes in favour of any candidate which could affect the election of a candidate, the members at the Annual General Meeting shall elect one of such candidates to fill the vacancy for which he was nominated by a Resolution passed by a simple majority of members present and voting thereon.
  - (10) If any question shall arise as to the validity or invalidity of a ballot paper, or whether any particular member has or has not been elected to any particular Office, a statement by the Returning Officer that the relevant voting paper is or is not valid or that a particular member has or has not been elected to a particular Office shall be conclusive.

- For the purposes of these Rules, the office of an Officer of the Club or of an ordinary member of the Committee becomes vacant if the Officer or member:-
  - (a) ceases to be a member of the Club;
  - (b) becomes an insolvent under administration within the meaning of the Companies (Victoria) Code:
  - (c) resigns his office by notice in writing given to the Secretary;
  - (d) absents himself from three consecutive Committee meetings without leave of the Committee;
  - (e) if as a member of the VCA. he is disqualified or suspended by the VCA. whilst the Club remains an affiliate of the VCA.

#### **VOTING OF MEMBERS**

- 27 (1) At meetings of members or of the Committee or of a Sub-Committee the mode of voting shall in the first instance be by a show of hands, or if required by two members by an actual division or by ballot and the Chairman shall have an ordinary and in the case of equality also a casting vote and all questions shall be decided by the majority of votes of the members voting in person at any such meeting provided that on a resolution relating to the election of the Officer Bearers or of the members of the Committee or relating to the expulsion of members, the foregoing shall not apply and in lieu thereof votes shall be taken in accordance with the relevant Clause of the Rules.
  - (2) Every member who was a financial member of the Club for not less than three months of the financial year preceding the Annual General Meeting and is currently a financial member shall be entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting and shall be eligible to nominate or be nominated as an Office Bearer or member of the Committee. Unless the Club's By-laws provide otherwise a member may be nominated for but not hold more than one position on the Committee, except for the position of Public Officer.
  - (3) No person becoming a member between the closing date of the financial year preceding the Annual General Meeting and the date of the Annual General Meeting, shall be eligible to vote at the Annual General Meeting, nominate. or be nominated as an Office Bearer or member of the Committee.
  - (4) In all matters not covered by these Rules the Rules of common debate shall apply provided always that the best interests of the general members of the Club be served and general members have the right to vote in favour or against any Committee decision.

#### MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE

- 28 (1) Meetings of the Committee shall be held at such place and at such time as the Committee from time to time determines.
  - (2) The Secretary or his representative shall attend all meetings of the Committee. The minutes of such meetings signed by the Chairman thereof or by the Chairman of a confirmatory meeting shall be accepted as sufficient evidence of the proceedings of such meeting.
  - (3) The quorum for a Committee meeting shall be not less than one half of the members present in person or such other number as prescribed by members. (See by-law No. 8)
  - (4) The Secretary shall call a meeting of the Committee whenever requested to do so by the President or by three members of the Committee.
  - (5) The President, or in the President's absence, the Vice-President shall preside, or if the President and the Vice-President are absent, such one of the remaining members of the Committee as may be chosen by the members present shall preside.
  - (6) A member of the Committee shall not vote in respect of any contract or proposed contract with the Club in which he is interested or in respect of any matter arising therefrom and if he does so vote, his vote shall not be counted.
  - (7) All acts done by any meeting of the Committee or of a Sub-Committee thereof or of a Sub-Committee appointed by the members or by any person acting as a member of the Committee or of a Sub-Committee notwithstanding that it is afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of the Committee or of a Sub-Committee or of any person acting as aforesaid, or that the members of the Committee or any of them or of a Sub-Committee were disqualified shall be as

- valid as if any such person had been validly appointed and was qualified to be a member of the Committee or of such Sub-Committee.
- (8) A resolution in writing signed by all members of the Committee for the time being entitled to receive notice of a meeting of the Committee shall be as valid and effectual as if it has been passed at a meeting of the Committee duly held and convened. Any such resolution may consist of several documents in like form each signed by one or more members of the Committee.
- (9) Subject to Clause 28(3) the Committee may act, notwithstanding any vacancy on Committee.
